International association honors local member Scott Macdonald

Longtime CWQA member receives WQA's Award of Merit for
commitment to quality water treatment

The Water Quality Association presented Ontario business leader Scott Macdonald (Envirogard Products Limited) their Award of Merit at its annual convention and trade show in San Antonio last month.

The WQA's Award of Merit is given for "exceptional service to the water quality improvement industry."

In presenting the award, WQA stated: "Scott has given his time and expertise to the Canadian Water Quality Association and to WQA."

As a pioneering president of CWQA in the early nineties, Scott developed the organization's first education and certification program. He is an active member of advisory boards that help provincial governments and the national government in Canada draft regulatory and technical matters.



Summary of Contributions

CWQA - Scott has served on the CWQA Board of Directors from 1983 to 2010, the Board of Governors from 1988 - 2010 and served as President from 1992-1994 when he developed the first Education/Certification program for the CWQA.

WQA - Scott served on the WQA Government Relations Committee from 2003-2010 and The Board of Directors from 2005 -2008.

Plumbing Industry Advisory Committee (PIAC) and Canadian Advisory Council on Plumbing (CACP) - Scott has been a member of the PIAC and the CACP since 2006. These bodies advise provincial and national governments of regulatory and technical matters related to the plumbing industry, drinking water and waste water.

CSA International - Scott was a member of the Canadian Standards Association (CSA International) task force to develop the CSA B483 Technical Committee from 2001-2003 and served as first TC Chair from 2003-2007. This Committee developed and published the first Canadian Drinking Water Treatment Unit Standard B483.1, for inclusion in the Canadian National Plumbing Code in 2014.
